Join a day of fun and community celebration at your local fire station on Saturday, October 30 from 1 to 3 PM.

We will also be celebrating Station 17's 50th birthday. Originally built in 1971, the Petrovitsky fire station has served the Fairwood community ever since then.

Back in 1968, District 40 citizens approved a \$250,000 construction bond to pay for the cost of land, construction of a fire station, several fire engines & vehicles, and necessary equipment.

While that price seems reasonable today, it was an extremely expensive investment at the time!

Station 17 underwent a major remodel in 2013 to upgrade to federal safety and seismic standards as well as to change the layout of the building to be more efficient. The upgrades included a training/media area, bunker storage room, improved dormitories (to house both men and women firefighters), a remodeled kitchen, and a dedicated Ham-radio room.

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY



DAYLIGHT SAVINGS TIME ENDS on November 7, so now is a good time to review a few safety tips when walking in the dark:

- Walk in well-lit areas
- Carry a flashlight or other light source
- Obey traffic signals and devices
- Walk with someone
- Watch for turning vehicles
- Wear bright clothing and/or a reflector
- Assume drivers do not see you
- Stay on sidewalks and pedestrian pathways when available



Unplug
Don't be a distracted walker.



Never Jaywalk
Use crosswalks and intersections.



Stay Alert
All the way across the intersection.



Watch for turning
Vehicles of all kinds.



Be bright
Wear reflective clothing at night.



Make eye contact
Don't walk until traffic stops.

RECIPE

This recipe shall be known as **Thai Chicken Curry**, prepared by Firefighter Pageau

From the kitchen of **Station 17, A Shift** This recipe serves 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10

INGREDIENTS	DIRECTIONS
5 to 6 tbsp Thai Red Curry Paste ,	✓ Heat oil in large heavy skillet over medium-high heat
3 tbsp vegetable oil	✓ Add curry paste & extras. Cook for 2 minutes until it "dries out"
1 cup chicken broth	✓ Add chicken broth & simmer until liquid reduces by half
14 oz coconut milk	✓ Add coconut milk, lime leaves, sugar & fish sauce
1 tbsp sugar	✓ Add chicken, then turn heat down to medium & simmer 8-10 minutes until chicken is cooked
2 tsp fish sauce	✓ Add squash & beans. Cook until squash is cooked & sauce is thickened. Add basil leaves
12 oz boneless, sliced chicken thighs	✓ Add basil leaves
5 oz cubed pumpkin or butternut squash	✓ Serve over jasmine rice and enjoy!
4 oz cut green beans	
6 kaffir lime leaves & 12 Thai basil leaves	
Extras: minced garlic cloves , 2 tsp grated ginger , 1 tbsp chopped lemongrass
